# ABOUT MCC'S FOOD PANTRY

Monday - Thursday 1:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m.

The MCC Food Pantry is a full choice pantry that mainly serves the 53204 area. Families and individuals are able to choose preferred foods to fit their tastes and needs along with infant need items. Hunger Task Force is the supplier of free and healthy food.

#### **Eligibility Requirements**

Participants must be income eligible to receive goods. Please visit mccwi.org to view TEFAP WI household income eligibility guidelines.

#### What You Need For Your Visit

- Age, First and Last name are required for all household members
- Identification for household members is not required, but preferred
- Proof of address is not required, but preferred





#### **INFANT NEEDS**

MCC's Food Pantry also provides diapers and formula for children with no zip code restriction. Distributed during regular pantry hours.

#### **Formula Requirements**

- Guardian's name, address, and phone number is required. (or the person picking up)
- Proof of baby age is required
- By the 2<sup>nd</sup> visit, must bring Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) card
- Limited to 1 can of formula per infant per month

#### **Diaper Requirements**

- Upon visit, the person picking up must provide their name along with the name of the baby and their diaper size
- Before coming into the pantry, please call ahead to verify that we have the size you need

The Commodity Supplemental Food Program Senior Stockbox provides a box once a month to low-income seniors. The box includes protein, breakfast items, juice & more. Stockboxes are subject to a waitlist. Please visit mccwi.org for more information.

#### **Eligibility Requirements**

- Must be 60 years or older
- Bring proof of age/identification
  - Utility bill, lease, etc.
- If the participant is unable to pickup themself, another individual can serve as a proxy and pickup on their behalf.
  - Proxy must bring the senior's ID and their own, a signed & dated letter for proof to pickup, and participant's phone number
